


- Over pressure of the bow.



- Dotted slurs are used to indicated larger phrasings.




- Feathered beams are gestural and do not need to follow the exact timing of the meter.



-Rapid and random glissando; utilizing the full range of the indicated string, contour depicted does not necessarily need to be followed.


## **Bow Motion**

This piece utilizes independent motion of the bow, notated above the violin part in its own staff. The center line of the staff represents normal or ordinario bowing position (example 3 below). The lowest line position indicates bowing as close as possible to the bridge, resulting in a harsh and gravely tone (example 1 below). Line position between the bottom and middle indicates normal Sul Ponticello (example 2 below). Inversely, the topmost line indicates molto Sul Tasto (example 5 below). Line position between the center and topmost position indicates normal Sul Tasto (example 4 below).



Rhythm is notated above the bow motion staff. This is to aid with the alignment of gestures as well as imply independent rhythms for bow movement. Dotted lines may appear to help depict alignments as a courtesy in more active moments.

Circles depicted in the bow motion staff direct the performer to move the bow in a circular motion over the appropriate string. The performer should never break contact with the string when performing this bowing. Notated rhythms above the bow motion staff dictate bow speed, where each circle indicates a note duration appropriate to the implied rhythm.

\*Circle bowing- move the bow in circles over the string, never lifting the bow from the string. Rhythm of circles should reflect rhythm depicted above.

Slowly tremolo between open string and natural harmonic.

Violin part with dynamics *sub.f* to *f*, a slanted line, and *ff*.

Violin part with dynamics *sub.f* to *f*, a slanted line, and *ff*. It includes markings III, IV, *p*, *ff*, *accel.*, *a tempo*, III, IV, *pp*, *sffz*, and *f*.

Repeat 4-6 times, decrescendo through entire gesture.

This section begins with a sustained note on the G string. It then transitions to a fast, rhythmic pattern. An instruction specifies that the glissando should reach the highest possible note on the G string. The dynamic changes from *p* to *mp* to *f*.

Gliss. down from the highest note on the G string.
